The Role

The New College of Humanities at Northeastern wishes to appoint an Assistant Professor in Design. The appointee will be responsible for delivering [Design Process and Systems](#) (a first-year undergraduate course for visiting Northeastern University students) and for contributing to the on-going development of Design as a core component of a new Art & Design curriculum. Preference will be given to candidates with a background in design practice or with a degree in Design and to candidates with active interests in the relationship of design to one or more of the following areas: software and/or technology; employment contexts; diversity and inclusion.

- Core duties include: delivering teaching to mobility students from the Northeastern Global Network; building the College's provision in the area of Design; providing service through contributions to e.g. faculty meetings, open days, admissions, interviews, etc.
- We particularly encourage applications from those with an interest in innovative teaching, learning and assessment; those with experience of supporting a wide variety of students; and those belonging to groups underrepresented in UK higher education. We are open to appointing on a reduced fraction/job-share basis subject to our business needs.

Department

Art History is institutionally housed within the Faculty of History at NCH. The department is entering into an ambitious new phase of development which will see Design become a core component of a new interdisciplinary degree programme, due to be launched in 2024. Excellent provision in Art & Design teaching, shaped by existing faculty strengths and elaborated in collaboration with colleagues across the Northeastern University global network, will offer students in London exciting new major and minor degree pathways. Design research methods and systems thinking as well as and digital competencies will feature prominently.

About the College

Founded in 2012, New College of the Humanities has established itself as a prestigious higher education institution based in the heart of London. After becoming part of Northeastern University's global network in early 2019, the College has undergone a period of rapid growth, having been granted Taught Degree Awarding Powers in February 2020 and moved to a new, state-of-the-art campus in 2021. NCH continues to grow further expanding its student cohort, courses, network and opportunities.
